PURPOSE OF MDP

The MDP (formally Instrumental Music Program) caters for young musicians from all backgrounds that wish to pursue their interest in music performance and excellence beyond the scope of the junior classroom music program. The program aims to provide your child with the opportunity to:

- Apply practical instrumental knowledge on their chosen instrument •
- Perform regularly in a variety of contexts in front of their peer groups, • other members of the college and the wider community
- Perform and participate in a music ensemble/s •
- Further develop and expand their knowledge and musicianship through • exposure to different genres and styles and expert instruction
- Be involved in an exclusive program with students across all year levels 7-12
- Gain access to network with industry professionals



Students who are enrolled in MDP will be involved in/have access to the following:

- 1 x 30-minute weekly lesson with an instrumental music specialist on their chosen instrument. Lessons occur on a rotating basis during class time either in larger or smaller groups or individually. Lesson times will appear on students' Compass schedules.
- Admission into an MDP Ensemble as directed by the instrumental specialist - dependent on instrument/level at lunchtime, before/after school as stipulated by the instrumental specialist – Participation in a relevant ensemble is compulsory to receive subsidized fee (See: fee structure for details)
- MDP specific incursions ٠
- MDP Performance Master classes
- The opportunity to enter to be selected to perform at the • **College Evening of Excellence for the Arts**
- **Excursions** to see live performances
- Solo performance opportunities in an MDP Studio Concert once a term
- Group performance in specific MDP ensemble concert once a semester - These concerts are compulsory are all MDP students
- Performance opportunities for important College events such as assemblies etc.
- School based social performances (lunchtimes etc.)
- Regular personalised feedback/communication with Instrumental Music teachers via MS Teams
- Use of rehearsal/practice rooms and performing arts facilities for non-college/personal music use at recess/lunchtime

OVERVIEW

Information

Commencing 2024, classroom Music will not be offered in year 7. Mainstream classroom Music classes will commence in year 8 for one semester. As such, we strongly encourage year 7 students to enroll in MDP so they are able to begin their music studies and develop their practical skills as soon as possible. When undertaking practical studies, such as playing an instrument, early adoption is paramount in maximising the potential of each student over the course of study.

Year 7 MDP students will be part of the **Junior Musician Program**. Here they will work with their instrumental teachers, most likely in small groups, to complete practical, technical and theory tasks that align with the Victorian School Curriculum. Students will be assessed on these elements throughout the year by their instrumental teacher and will obtain a certificate for each level. This program will enable students to have the best opportunity to be at the expected level (or above) when commencing year 8 classroom music and beyond. Joining MDP in year 7 will also provide new students with further opportunities to meet like-minded students and be part of a large team of students across year levels.

We believe this early exposure to music and involvement in learning an instrument to be extremely important in giving students every opportunity to explore and excel in music related pathways throughout their schooling.

HOW ARE STUDENTS ASSESSED IN MDP?

Students will be assessed informally via the following:

- Regular performances in solo/group contexts. This is accompanied by feedback from their instrumental/classroom Teachers.
- Semester Ensemble Performance participation concerts/performances
- Semester LAB reports
- Junior Musician Program Level Certificates with ongoing assessments



EXPECTATIONS FOR MDP STUDENTS

- Have a willingness to perform regularly in front of others including other college ensembles
- Actively participate in the program, rehearsals and performances as determined by music staff
- Have access to the instrument of their choice outside of the college and commit to regular practice at home each week on material given in their instrumental music lesson
- Have an open mind when being exposed to new, different and unfamiliar styles of music
- Conduct themselves in a manner that meets the College's rules and expectations, always demonstrating professionalism towards staff/ensemble members and maintain 80% attendance to all lessons, classes and scheduled masterclasses.

WHAT FEES ARE ASSOCIATED WITH MDP?

As participation in the Musician Development Program is voluntary, not all of the cost will be covered within the College budget. The entry fee for the MDP starts from \$220 annually but is dependent on level, tuition structure, the instrument chosen, instrument hire options, consumables throughout the year as well the possibility of excursions/incursions. A comprehensive tiered, fee list and structure is below, which will outline each instrument area and associated costs including hire if applicable.

Students accepted into MDP will be allocated to lessons based on their level, year and experience. This is solely at the discretion of the music director and in consultation with the instrumental music teacher/s. It is expected that beginner students in Year 7-9 will be allocated to training/group lessons and later years students (10/11/12) will be allocated to individual lessons. Individual tuition is only reserved for senior students in the primary instance. Tuition fees are tiered dependent on student enrolment.

Students who may not be eligible for the lesson program due to teachers being at capacity or through own choice may wish to participate in ensembles only. This means they are still an MDP member and will have all the other benefits of the program but don't have the 30-minute instrumental music lesson each week.

APPLICATON PROCESS

- 1. Consider and read through the proceeding specific information for MDP and the apply via the electronic MS Forms link provided by the college.
- The MDP team will consider all applications and after careful consideration will communicate with all applicants by mid to late Term 4 of their decision if successful. Offers will be sent out/advised via the primary email contact provided on the MDP application form.
- 3. In the event that all instrument positions are at capacity, students will remain on a waiting list or may look to seeking a different instrument. This will be communicated via email.
- 4. Students who seek interest in a Brass or Woodwind instrument may be invited to complete a trial in the first two weeks of Term 1, 2024. This allows students to try <u>all</u> of the possible instruments and a specialist will give a recommendation to what instrument is best suited to the student based on natural ability, ease of making a sound and availability in their lesson blocks. This process ensures a greater rate of success for the student. Offers will then be considered and sent out to parents by end of Week 2 Term 1 2024.
- 5. Any student who has been offered a position in MDP and to learn an instrument will have their application formally processed and the applicable fee invoiced to their Kambrya College account. Please note that lessons for successful applicants will not be able to commence without a down payment of a minimum of one terms' tuition. Parents can make alternative arrangements with the office to pay any remaining fees as best suited to their situation.

OTHER THINGS TO CONSIDER:

Kambrya College's MDP Funding comes from the Region/Department and it is this funding that allows us to offer a subsidised fee structure for our student that is so much more competitive than tuition prices outside of the college.

However, our funding is based on numbers of students in ensembles and so, whilst we also truly believe that ensemble participation is hugely beneficial, attendance at weekly rehearsals and designated performances as stipulated for the year is <u>compulsory</u> if you wish to benefit from these lower, subsidised prices – see fee structure below. Compulsory performance events for the year are Ensemble Concerts (one per semester) and MDP Masterclasses (min 1 per semester).

Performance in ensembles is essential to being a better musician but it also allows for our program to offer lower fees on eligible instruments. We also love to share the achievements of our students so recordings, videos and photos may be taken from time to time.

There may be incidental costs for students during the year in addition to the above fees - *camp, excursions for individual ensembles, band festivals* etc. You will be notified if this is applicable to your child as required. Additionally, students will be allocated into ensembles as directed by the instrumental teacher/director of music.

When applying for MDP there are \underline{two} different electronic application forms to consider:

DESCRIPTION: Application form for students wanting to have instrumental music lessons and participate in ensembles at the college. • MDP Masterclass/Ensembles Only | Form B 2024

DESCRIPTION: Application form for students who may already be having instrumental music lessons outside of the college but want to only be in ensembles or participate in some way. This form only requires our masterclass levy and MDP Polo shirt fee to be paid in order to participate in MDP. Please note that some instrumental experience may be directly applicable to the college ensemble program but please enquire should you have questions.
